Pictures, mementos, heirlooms and keepsakes are treasured reminders of the one Prince William loved. One very special treasure was Princess Diana's sapphire and diamond engagement ring. The unique ring would not be given away lightly or carelessly, nor would it be worn on the finger of someone not loved or valued deeply by William. It would be reserved for the love of his life. It would be gladly given to the one to whom he wanted to express his deepest love.

As heart-warming as the royal love story is, there is an even greater love story to be told. As meaningful as Prince William's engagement gift was, there is a love gift that outstrips all other statements of love and affection.

The Gift was wrapped in swaddling clothes and snuggled in a manger in Bethlehem. The Gift dressed in street clothes of commoners and walked the dusty roads of earth in pursuit of those to whom He could bring blessings and



happiness. The Gift rested His weary head in a boat sailing to other shores to seek and to save the perishing. The Gift sat at a well and blessed a thirsty destitute woman with living water.

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Grandest Ship Afloat

The beginning of the 20th century saw many new British passenger liners entering service. Each one seemed to be larger, faster and more luxurious than the one that had gone before, until there was the biggest and grandest of all the ships, the *Titanic!* Weighing 48,000 tons and with a length of 882 feet, this new ship was the pride of the seas. With its twelve watertight compartments, they claimed it to be "practically unsinkable".

The rich and famous soon booked their places in the lavish and expensive cabins. Thousands of people came to Southampton on Wednesday April 10, 1912 to see *Titanic* embark on its maiden voyage to New York. Little did those people know that this was to be its first and last voyage.

Within five days the majority of people on board that ship were in eternity!

For Those in Peril on the Sea

On Sunday night April 12, 1912 a hymn singing evening was arranged. About a hundred passengers gathered in the second class dining saloon for the occasion. One of the many hymns sung that night was William Whiting's famous seafaring hymn "Eternal Father, Strong to Save", containing the words, "Oh hear us when we cry to Thee, for those in peril on the sea." Those enjoying this evening of singing did not know

that within two hours they would all be enduring an unprecedented great peril in the freezing waters of the Atlantic Ocean.

As you sail across life's ocean, have you prepared for the one certainty in life - death? Have you ever stopped to think of the awful danger your soul is in if you are not right with God? The Lord Jesus Christ said, "what will it profit a man if he gains the whole world, and loses his own soul?" (Mark 8:36).

Iceberg Dead Ahead!

Most people on board the great liner were retiring for bed at 11:40 p.m. when Fredrick Fleet, a sailor in the crow's nest of the forward mast. sighted a dark mass in the water ahead of the ship. Picking up the telephone connecting him to the bridge he called out, "Iceberg dead ahead". First Officer, William Murdock, immediately ordered the helmsmen to steer, "Hard a starboard". Travelling at 23 knots (26.5 mph) the ship seemed reluctant to respond but finally her bows started to slowly move to the left. It seemed that she would miss the iceberg. However, as *Titanic* tried to skirt around the ice a light vibration shuddered through the ship, alerting those on the bridge that their efforts had tragically been unsuccessful.

To the Rescue!

At 12:15 a.m. Harold Cottam, the wireless operator of the steamship Carpathia, picked up Titanic's distress call. He immediately woke his captain, Arthur Rostron. Rostron made every effort to cover the 58 perilous miles to the floundering ship as quickly as possible. Carpathia was pushed to the limit as Rostron wove a treacherous course through hazardous pack ice and icebergs! During the nearly four hours it took to reach Titanic's position, Captain Rostron ordered his crew to prepare for the reception of survivors. The next morning when all the survivors of the disaster had been safely rescued. Rostron looked around the

barren expanse of sea. As he gazed at the dangerous pack ice he exclaimed, "Someone's hand other than my own was on the helm of my ship last night!"

The Bible states, "the Father has sent the Son as Saviour of the world" (1 John 4:14). The Lord Jesus did not come out of a request for help from a ruined sinking world. He came in great love, "to save sinners" (1 Timothy 1:15). By dying on the cross at Calvary the Lord Jesus paid in full the price that a righteous God demanded for our sins. Just as Captain Rostron issued orders to get his crew ready to receive survivors, we need to obey God's command to be ready for Heaven. The Bible says God, "commands all men everywhere to repent" (Acts 17:30). Have you repented (turned away) from your sin and trusted Christ as your Saviour? As you remember the tragic loss of Titanic may your soul be averted from eternal disaster. "Believe on the Lord Fesus Christ, and you will be saved" (Acts 16:31).



World Peace

Pursuing an impossible dream?

Tragi war protesters, hippies, and **L**peace movements represent only a handful of the billions of people who yearn for a world where peace reigns. In spite of their desires, in the past century tens of millions of people have died in wars and hundreds of thousands have been victims of violent crimes, ethnic cleansing, genocide, crime sprees, cybercrime, gang wars and malicious behaviour; all fuelled by human greed, jealousy and vindictiveness. This commentary underlines the prophet Isaiah's words, "There is no peace, says my God, for the wicked" (Isaiah 57:21). Try as we may, lasting peace is impossible at the world level and even the individual level.

However, peace is not an impossible dream. God desires that every person would have peace in their own hearts, peace with their fellow man and especially peace with God. However, this peace does not come from human efforts - it is a gift from God that must be received by faith.

To find this peace we must first acknowledge our restless sinful natures. We can never be satisfied, because our spiritually empty hearts are always seeking something more attractive, or living in fear, or envying others.

God has provided a basis for removing the greatest cause of our unrest; the guilt and the penalty that our sins deserve. God provided the Lord Jesus Christ to be the Saviour and the source of peace with God. Centuries before Christ's coming, Isaiah spoke of Him as the "Prince of Peace" (Isaiah 9:6). After His death and resurrection, Peter preached "peace through Jesus Christ" (Acts 10:36) and Paul referred to Him as the one who "made peace through the blood of His cross" (Colossians 1:20).

While He was on earth the Lord Jesus brought peace and health to people who were suffering. During His sufferings at Calvary, He endured God's judgment for sin and made a basis of peace that will be imparted to everyone who trusts in Him. You may have many disturbances in your life - unemployment, marriage problems, sickness, finances, legal issues, to name a few. However, if by faith you accept the salvation and pardon that the Lord Jesus Christ offers, your heart will be filled with "...the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding..." (Philippians 4:7) even in the midst of these circumstances. Why not stop striving to manufacture peace? Rest on the reconciliation and peace provided by the Lord Jesus Christ today.

A car crash claimed the life of a young person. When organ donor cards are signed, potential donors do not specify the recipients. Whoever is most in need

qualifies. That time, it was Steve Jobs who received the life giving transplant.

Saved by a Death

Apple's Founder

Have you ever thought about the generosity of the One who chose to give up His life by dying on a cross in order to save you? Your spiritual disease of sin is far worse than any form of cancer. Without the generous intervention of Another, you are facing certain eternal death.

Sin is such a deadly spiritual disease. It leaves us completely without strength to save ourselves. Left to our own efforts, we would face eternal death and separation from God. But consider this amazing piece of news: "When we were still without strength, in due time Christ died for the ungodly" (Romans 5:6).

It must have been a very challenging, fearful time. The miners were in the dark. 622 meters below the surface of the earth, separated from family, and with limited supplies. The rescue effort was brilliant. A capsule was sent down through a narrow tunnel to save each man one by one. What a plan! That capsule was a lifesaver.

Each man had to put his faith in the capsule and actually step through the door if he was going to be brought up safely. If the men had merely chosen to admire the capsule or put a picture of it on the mine wall, they would have been left in darkness rather than living in the light of the sun again.

This is how many people treat the Lord Jesus Christ today. They say He was a good man, some people even hang a cross around their neck or have His picture on the wall. However, they have never believed in His sacrifice to save them from the power of sin in their lives and from the judgment God says sin deserves. Could this be you?



The Lord Jesus Christ left a wonderful place of light called Heaven to come down to this dark sinful world to pay for our sins on the cross. Iraq-based American truck driver Paul Conroy is attacked, and then finds himself buried alive in a coffin, six feet underground. Using his mobile phone, he begins to call his list of contacts to tell them he is alive and to beg them to locate him. Time is as limited as his available oxygen. Those above ground try to find him, but to no avail. Paul Conroy dies in a coffin. Is it true? Or is it someone's worst nightmare?

Actually, it is the plot of a thriller movie starring Canadian actor Ryan Reynolds as Paul Conroy. In an interview Reynolds was asked, "Do you think about your own mortality in ways that you hadn't before?" Reynolds replied, "Yeah, it really started the ball rolling on that little doozie. In fact, I wish it hadn't. I think about it all the time still." He knew when he accepted the role that he would have to face death as Paul Conroy, but what he didn't count on was having to confront his own mortality.

Death is not a probability but a certainty. One hundred percent of people die. The Bible teaches us that it is wise to consider how short life is and the end of it. "Oh, that they were wise, that they understood this, that they would consider their latter end" (Deuteronomy 32:29)! Also, "Lord, make me to know my end, and what is the measure of my days, that I may know how frail I am" (Psalm 39:4). Why

is it wise to think about our mortality? So that we can act now! Death is not the end but a means to our eternal destinies. Though our bodies decay, our souls live on. Where we will be after we die depends on our choice in this life. Our sins will separate us from God

Death is an appointment that cannot be postponed or cancelled. Hebrews 9:27 says, "... it is appointed for men to die once, but after this the judgment." You have a choice: "He who believes in the Son has everlasting life; and he who does not believe the Son shall not see life, but the wrath of God abides on him" (John 3:36). It is good that Ryan Reynolds is still plagued by these thoughts; he still has time to prepare. "It is a fearful thing to fall into the hands of the living God" (Hebrews 10:31). Have you prepared for your final appointment?

Grand Canyon Long Jumpers Would Perish!

 \mathbf{I} magine a long jump competition held at the world famous Grand Canyon. Two star athletes agree to participate. Together they stand at the breathtaking precipice. Their stomachs churn as they peer down one mile into the Canyon. Quite a drop! They look across - 18 miles is a large gap. But they are the very best long jumpers in the world. If anyone can do it, they can!

The first competitor prepares for the jump, runs, and with incredible power pushes his legs off the side of the Canyon, catapulting through the air - 28 feet, 5.75 inches! That was his best!

The next athlete with intensity and focus takes his turn. Like a bullet, he goes into the air. The distance? 29 feet, 4.5 inches. His very best! Yes, he made it farther than the first athlete - but they both fell short of the distance of 18 miles.

If this was a true story both participants would have died even if they were the very best performers in the long jump event. One made it a little farther than the other, but neither of them had what it took to span the distance.

There is a wider and deeper canyon between sinners and God. "Your iniquities (sins) have separated you from your God" (Isaiah 59:2). This canyon was formed in the Garden of Eden when Adam rebelled against God.

Even the best person is not able to make it across the chasm. The distance is too great. Sin has caused a divide that none of us can bridge. No matter how many good things we do, or how sincere we are, or how religious our life may be - the Bible says even the best fall short. None of us have what it takes to get across the divide. We will perish if we try to get across by ourselves.

"For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God" (Romans 3:23).

The Lord Jesus Christ dealt with the divide caused by our sin. He died in our place and is our bridge across the chasm. He is the only way to Heaven. We can trust Him. "For Christ also suffered once for sins, the just for the unjust, that He might bring us to God" (1 Peter 3:18).

Sure Entry

In February 2010, ten American volunteers went to Haiti to offer their assistance. Jim Allen was a last minute addition to the group. He was invited by his cousin and his cousin's son to go along to help the earthquake ravaged people. Although he did not know the other members of the group of men and women, Jim felt his construction experience could be put to good use with the team.

Instead, shortly after arrival in Haiti, he and the nine other volunteers were arrested as they tried to transport 33 Haitian children to an orphanage in the Dominican Republic. The group believed the children between the ages of two months and 12 years old were orphans, but in fact many of them had at least one living parent. The children were brought to the bus by adults. The Americans erroneously assumed the adults were aunts, uncles or grandparents and not parents. The team of volunteers thought they had all the necessary valid documents to take the children to the Dominican Republic, but Haitian officials say the group did not have permission to take the children out of the country.

The Americans were charged with child kidnapping and criminal association. After a complex, international legal battle, Jim Allen and seven other volunteers were released. They had been in a Haitian jail for three weeks. Another volunteer was released after a month in jail. The last member of the group was released after spending 3 months and 8 days behind bars.



It must have been an ordeal for all concerned, but those who stand before God without a valid entry into His house will suffer far worse. They will be rejected forever from entering Heaven. Some may believe that the record of their religious efforts such as baptism or church attendance will gain them entry into God's presence. Others may feel that good deeds, charitable donations, and good references from others will suffice. However, the Bible tells us there is only one way into Heaven. Jesus said, "I am the way, the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through Me" (John 14:6).

The Lord Iesus Christ paid the price for our sin. Only He can give us a sure entry into Heaven. Have you trusted Him? Be sure you have a valid entry to God's Heaven for eternity.

The people thought this was a great idea. Elijah let the prophets of Baal go first. They called to Baal from morning to noon. But no one answered. Elijah mockingly told them to call louder because perhaps their god was on a journey or asleep. Baal's prophets did cry loudly. They even cut themselves as their traditions dictated in an effort to make Baal hear. Still, no one answered.

Elijah, when it was his turn, built a trench around the altar. He had the people pour water on the sacrifice and the wood. Everything was soaked and the trench was full of water. He prayed that God would let it be known that He is God. Fire fell from Heaven and consumed the burnt offering, the wood, the stones, the dust and even the water in the trench. Then the people knew that the Lord is God.

Because they misled the people of Israel, Elijah had all Baal's prophets killed.

Jezebel retaliated by sending a message to Elijah that she was going to kill him.

Elijah was afraid. He ran away, alone in the wilderness. He reminded God that he was the only one of His prophets left and Jezebel wanted to kill him too!

God encouraged Elijah and told him that there were 7000 people in Israel who hadn't bowed to Baal. Elijah was not alone. He could carry on with God's strength.

Sometimes things happen to make us feel despair: acts of terrorism, earthquakes, tsunamis, floods, sickness or the death of a loved one. We are not alone, God is listening. He sent the Lord Jesus Christ, His Son to take our place and make us right with God. "But we believe that through the grace of the Lord Jesus Christ we shall be saved" (Acts 15:11). Don't allow despair, defeat, denial or doubt to ruin your life. Turn your eyes to the Lord Jesus and serve Him. He is worthy! When we trust Him, we have His promise, "I will never leave you nor forsake you" (Hebrews 13:5).

rags" (Isaiah 64:6). We have offended Him with our sin. "Your iniquities have separated you from your God" (Isaiah 59:2). God wants us to come to Him, not with good works and great words but with humility and repentance - recognizing

that we deserve not treats but judgment. "The wages of sin is death" (Romans 6:23).

When we come to God in repentance, we discover that His goodness greatly exceeds our expectations. "You are God, ready to pardon, gracious and merciful, slow to anger, abundant in kindness" (Nehemiah 9:17). We find a God of love and goodness. Acknowledge your sin and reach out by faith to receive His undeserved and unearned love and goodness.

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
